The Meeting was called to order at 10:04 AM by President Rick Reaves. Twenty members were present.

Officers Reports

Bits and Pieces Submitted by Pat Young



In our first Bits and Pieces segment indoors, Charlie Reiter showed off his AC generator from Cringle Model Engineering that he built from a kit of aluminum parts and painted in Christmas colors.

He showed another generator that he built (and featured in the November 2021 CallBoy issue) to a guy that referred him to a web site in the United Kingdom. It's easy to build, the aluminum casting are nice (but it's metric so a 6mm reamer would have been a great help) and he changed it slightly to use banana jacks instead of screw terminals. Charlie hasn't put a load on it yet so he doesn't have any specifics on the voltage output.



Charlie next showed a rubber tire for the McLaughlin tractor wheel made from a sheet 4 inches wide with treads cut on a radial arm saw. He fixtured the rubber sheet, clamped it down solidly, put a pair of dado sets together so he could make each groove in one pass, 3/4" wide & 3/16" deep. It smelled bad when do the individual cuts.



Monday after the December meeting he bonded the second tread. He thought that if he had to do more bonding he might get really good at it but it does looks like it will stay on.



His third item that he presented were two magazines titled "The Engineering Magazine" dated 1907 and 1903. Printed during the building of the Panama Canal, article include "Electrical and Mechanical Equipment of the Kimberley Mines", "The Later Processes for the Manufacture of Water Gas" and "Ore Quarrying in the Boundary District, British Columbia".

Finally, Charlie wanted to dispute the notion that he is the top builder in the club. "When you try to do things, sometimes you get lucky."

We are happy to be the beneficiary of all the builder's & presenters' efforts.

Hopefully another step forward for Harley! Using compressed air, I tested the plumbing of a steam powered water pump and it works! Harley's water glass rose by about an 1/8" which measured out to be about a cup of water in thirty seconds. I also measured the water in Harley's boiler represented by the water glass to be about 3/4 of a gallon. Next step will be adding a steam line to the pump.

"To Infinity & Beyond"!



p.s., This water pump was one of three made by Dave Gumz.



Using the lowest pipe, water from the steam pump comes in from the left or water from the injector comes in from the right; then it goes up and into the boiler.

I just need to route steam to the pump now. Yes, I'll pull out the popsicle stick support. :-)



Since I have Dave's 4-6-0 as well, the two locomotives can swap stories about my mad antics at the track. Now they're more than just blood brothers!

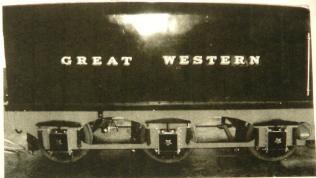
